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California City Managers in "Lake" Cities

Our past two issues included lists of cities with geographical descriptives, but we did not do all such names. Two folks from "lake" cities have suggested that we go beyond the hills, valleys, canyons and beaches and include a list of "lake" cities. So, here we go.

Not all of California's "lake" cities city managers are members of ICMA so they are not listed in the ICMA Who's Who Directory. Biographical information is sparse and extremely difficult to find on a few. City web sites are sometimes entirely void of information on their city managers. In fact, we have found some web sites that do not even list their city manager's name.

These are the "lake" cities we identified: <u>Big</u> <u>Bear Lake</u>, <u>Blue Lake</u>, <u>Canyon Lake</u>, <u>Clearlake</u>, <u>Lake Elsinore</u>, <u>Lake Forest</u>, <u>Lakeport</u>, <u>Lakewood</u>, <u>Mammoth Lakes</u>, <u>Shasta Lake</u>, <u>South Lake</u> <u>Tahoe</u>, <u>Tulelake</u>, <u>Westlake Village</u> and <u>Woodlake</u>. We also found <u>Sutter Creek</u> and <u>Walnut Creek</u>. Not all of these jurisdictions have city managers and information on some with city managers is difficult to find.

Tulelake (pronounced: "Too-lee lake") is 0 .4 square miles of corporate limits in Siskiyou County at an elevation of 4,066 feet above sea level. At the 2000 Census Tulelake had a population of 1,020. The community does not have a city manager or city administrator at There were two World War II this time. internment camps in the Tulelake area. There was an Italian and German prisoner-of-war camp, and the other camp housed nearly 18,000 Japanese Americans and Japanese alien residents. The Japanese internment camp was operated from May, 1942 to March, 1946. The Tule Lake War Relocation Center was one of ten Japanese internment camps in the U.S. It is located about 7-miles south of Tulelake.

<u>Sutter Creek</u> had a populatoin of 2,303 at the 2000 Census. Known as the "Jewel of the Mother Lode," the town was named for **John A**. **Sutter**, who owned the sawmill in <u>Coloma</u> where gold was discovered kicking off the "Gold Rush." <u>Sutter Creek</u> became a boom town. Many of the original brick buildings are still standing. **Leland Stanford** was one of <u>Sutter</u> <u>Creek</u>'s most famous residents. The League's 2008 City Managers Directory lists **J. Robert Duke** as City Administrator. He is also listed as Chief of Police in other sources.
