In 1994, former City Manager **Jim Barisic** founded Brandywine with a business plan to help revitalize established neighborhoods and to convert existing underutilized space into needed housing.

Many issues were discussed, questions addressed and speculations wondered. The possibility that <u>San Diego</u> Assembly Member **Toni Atkins** may be the next Speaker of the Assembly was mentioned. Since that time, he has worked his way up in the organization as an Administrative Assistant, Management Analyst, Assistant to the City Manager and Assistant City Manager. became City Manager in 2010 when Fred retired after 38-years with the City. earned a BA from California State University, Long Beach and an MPA from California State University, Fullerton. The Santa Fe Springs web page notes that Thad is married and is the father of three sons.

Accompanying City Manager **Thaddeus McCormack** was <u>Santa Fe Springs</u> Assistant City Manager, Administrative Services Director, and Finance Director **Jose Gomez**. Jose is a former member of the City of <u>Paramount</u> staff.





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Lakewood City Manager Howard L. Chambers, has been attending the Joe A. Gonsalves & Son annual City Manager Gettogether for many years. Howard received a 45-year ICMA Service Award

at ICMA's 99th Annual Conference in Boston. Howard has been listed in a number of Trackdown issues. It is believed that he is the California City Manager with the longest tenure in a single city. 

The city explored the notion of withdrawing from PERS in order to keep Deborah's services, but have discovered the cost too pricey for the Canyon Lake budget. The City Council gives Deborah rave reviews on her performance. Deborah is a retired City Clerk who served in a number of cities including: Bellflower, Solana Beach and Camarillo. Hawaiian Gardens, whose City Manager is **Ernesto Marquez**, was honored by First Lady Michelle Obama's "Let's Move" program for the City's fight against childhood obesity. Only 18 cities were singled out Nationwide.



Former <u>San Diego</u> City Manager **Jack McGrory** has provided a second contribution of \$1.2 million to San Diego State University. The money will be split
